Shannon Simpson played fast pitch softball since the age of 8. During the 10 years that she participated in NSA, she played in countless tournaments including 8 World Series tournaments held in Florida and along the east coast. In 1999 at the 18U World Series, Shannon was crowned Miss NSA 18U.

Shannon attended college on a softball scholarship and was able to continue her love of the game. During her freshmen year in college, she had the opportunity to play in the 2000 Indoor World Cup in Leon, France. After college, she returned home and was offered a teaching position at a local high school which allowed her to become the assistant high school varsity softball coach.

For Shannon's skill, love and devotion to the game of softball, she became the first female player and seventh player overall to be inducted into the NSA Hall of Fame in November 2003.
