The history of the Michigan City Park Department dates back to 1994. Michigan City Park Department was the first park in Northern Indiana to join the NSA. In 1994 Michigan City had just two (2) fields at Adams Park and with that Michigan City hosted several World Qualifiers and in 1995 hosted the Women's State Championships. In 1996 Michigan City hosted the Women's State and the Coed State. In 1999 plans were put into motion and construction of Patriot Park began. In 2001 Patriot Park opened its gates and exposed the softball and baseball communities to one of the finest facilities in the Midwest.

Since 1994, all Michigan City Park Department Leagues have been sanctioned 100% each and every year with NSA.

Michigan City Park Department was the first non-private facility to join the NSA in the State of Indiana.
